

The opportunity to invest in Augusta and the downtown is here and we need your help in molding a future where our children and families thrive with greater access to the arts. Augusta is the only state capital without an arts and cultural center. The Augusta Colonial Theater is a signature landmark of downtown Augusta and is recognized on the National Register of Historic Places. The mission of Colonial Theater, Inc. is to restore and operate this historic theater as an arts and cultural center for the benefit of the community.

Thanks to the dedication of a hardworking all-volunteer board, we continue to work toward that goal. This past year we've increased community presence, completed 50% design plans, navigated Federal pre-construction requirements, and continued developing a full plan for a multiphase construction project. Phase I will include full restoration of the 1,000 seat Augusta Colonial Theater along with the addition of a supporting building in order to become operational. Phase II will include further expansion to complete the cultural center and assist in long-term sustainability.

We need your help in ensuring that this critically important economic and community resource in our state capital becomes a reality. Your support during this time ensures continued operations of Colonial Theater, Inc. We have a full-time executive director, operational and maintenance costs for the building, as well as other development and administrative costs. We're planning to bring a few small community engagement events to the theater this season. We're also currently developing printed fundraising materials to aid in our restoration efforts.

THANK YOU to those who have already given! If you've not yet given this year, but support our mission, please know that every gift matters. Most of our donors make annual donations, though smaller monthly giving is sometimes more manageable for you. Just \$5 a month would total \$120 per year and \$30 per month (approximately \$1 per day) would add up to \$360 per year! We're certainly grateful for larger gifts, but small monthly gifts add up!



WHAT'S NEXT?

Senators Susan Collins and Angus King were instrumental in securing \$1.5 million in federal funding for the Augusta Colonial Theater as part of the Fiscal Year 2023 Housing and Urban Development appropriations bill. We're excited to announce that as of early January 2025, we have successfully cleared all the pre-construction Federal requirements (environmental assessments, etc.) in order to move forward with our stage rehabilitation and renovation project. We are currently in the process of determining the best timeline for completion of this project. Α rehabilitated and renovated stage area will bring us one step closer to becoming operational.





Originally built in 1913 as a silent movie house with some vaudeville acts, the Colonial Theater stage is too small for most performing arts programming. In order to accommodate a wide variety of modern productions, such as theater, dance, musical acts including orchestral performances, and more, we have chosen to extend the depth of the stage and adjust the wing walls. The updated area will retain the identifying features of the historic stage, while modernizing the space for the next generation. Plans call for rehabilitating and moving the proscenium forward, and keeping the historic decorative elements such as the wooden doors with their decorative pediments and other finishes and features of the wing ACT will work closely with walls. Maine Preservation to ensure the integrity of the historic building.
